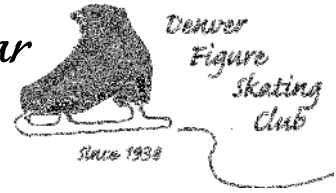


Denver FSC Highlights for 2006-7 Membership Year
